Optimist International Essay Contest

What is the 2010-2011 topic?

“How My Education is the Key to a Successful Future”



Clubs are allowed to give monetary awards of up to \$500 per winner for the Essay, CCDHH and Oratorical contests in addition to the official medallions. The Club level awards may be given in the form of a scholarship, savings bond or cash prize but are completely discretionary.

When is the Club deadline to submit the essay winner to the District contest?

The Club deadline for 2010-2011 is **February 28, 2011**.

Where do I order rule pads, posters, medallions, certificates of participation, etc.?

All materials can be ordered from the Corall Group by calling toll-free 1-866-739-9555, or faxing 514-739-7558.

Each District is given one **\$2500** scholarship for their first place winner. Dates for each District's judging are set by the District Essay Chair. The winner's paperwork must be turned in by each District to the Optimist International Programs Department by **April 15, 2011**. Upon receipt of the winner's paperwork, the student will be sent a congratulatory letter, an Enrollment Confirmation Statement, and a scholarship provisional.

What if my District wants to raise the amount of the scholarship or award additional scholarships?

Districts choosing to increase funding for scholarships or fund additional scholarships will need to manage those funds through other resources, such as District accounts or contributing those funds to the Optimist International Foundations.

Each District is given \$5,000 in scholarships. Districts with separate gender contests shall award the top boy and girl winner with a \$2,500 scholarship. Districts with combined gender contests may award two \$2,500 scholarships or a \$2,500, a \$1,500 and a \$1,000 scholarship to the first, second and third place winners respectively.

The District winners' materials must be turned in to the Programs Department no later than **June 15th, 2011**. Upon receipt of the winner's paperwork, each student will be sent a congratulatory letter, an Enrollment Confirmation Statement, and a scholarship provisional.

What is this program?

Statistics show that 99% of all teens have access to the internet and 94% of students admitted to being cyber bullied and did not tell an adult. The importance of protecting the children in your community is a major undertaking and your Club can play a vital role.

Internet Safety became an Optimist International program in December 2008. The program is underwritten by the Optimist International Foundations and was developed through a partnership with the Internet Keep Safe Coalition.

Adult Internet Safety Education Program

What is this program?

This program is geared for adults to be presented in groups, large or small with an interactive discussion format being utilized and is designed so that Clubs can make the presentations with as few as two people or as many as you like.

Where do I find the materials?

Clubs may request one packet of information for free and the packet will include a Club Member Education DVD, the Adult Safety Education DVD and supplemental documents that provide instruction on how to present the program and information that is utilized during the presentation.

Tri-Star Sports Skills Contest consists of competitions for boys and girls 8-13 years of age. The sports skills competition can be baseball, basketball, in-line or ice hockey, football or soccer. These competitions test children's ability levels in three events.

2010-2011 Community Projects Awards (CPA Books)

How should a Club entry be submitted?

All Club entries must be submitted in the official CPA binder or a plain 3-ring binder using the 2010-2011 Project Story format to the District Activities Chairperson.

What are the categories for the CPA program?

Community Service

Fundraising

When do these projects have to be completed?

CPA entries must be completed and received by your District no later than **September 30, 2011**. A list of Club CPA entries must then be received by Optimist International on the **District Entry Form** no later than **October 20, 2011**. District winning CPA books and the **District First Place Entry Form** must be received by Optimist International by **December 15, 2011**. What is the Future of Optimism Award?

The Future of Optimism Award is an extension to the current CPA awards. Every entry submitted for International competition that is not based on a current Optimist International program is eligible for this award. 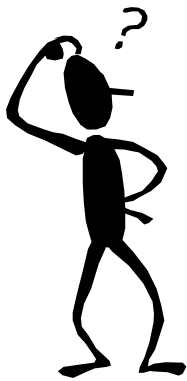
The International Programs Planning Guide
